John Johnson won the wood for the bring back challenge. Linda Jarvis brought in a oak bowl she tuned from the wood from an earlier challenge. Gerald Avery brought in his NE bowl from the January meeting bring back.

John Henry agreed to head up a sawdust session at Steve Hood's shop on March 14, the Saturday after the March meeting to talk about some of the turning techniques he uses.
